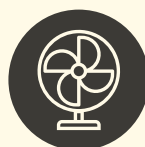

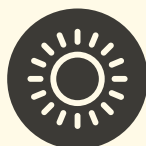

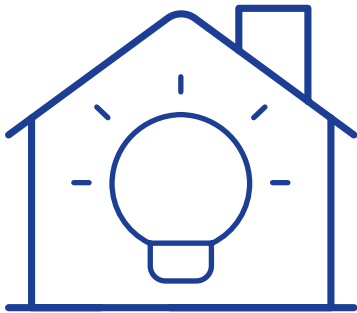

Healthy Haloumi Salad

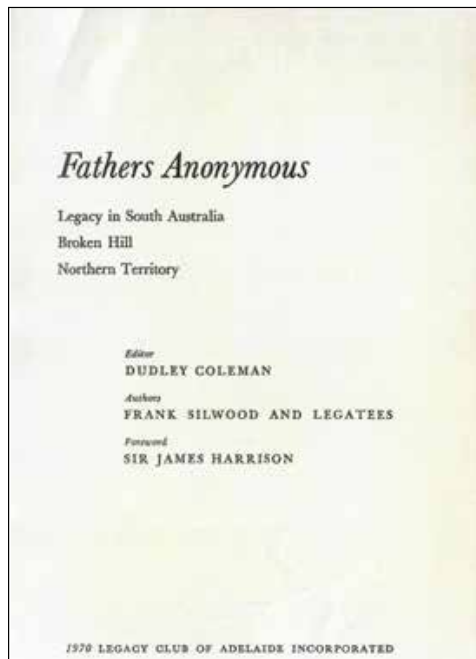


1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil	1 small yellow capsicum, chopped
1/2 small red onion, finely chopped	125g of packet microwave rice
1 garlic clove, crushed	100g haloumi cheese, sliced
1 1/2 tsp ground cumin	1/2 small avocado, sliced
1 1/2 tsp smoked paprika	1/2 cup shredded iceberg lettuce
1 tsp ground oregano	100g tomato medley, halved
1/4 tsp dried chilli flakes	1/2 long red chilli, sliced
125g lean beef mince	1 lime, halved, to serve
200g canned crushed tomatoes	1/4 cup chopped coriander

1. Heat 2 teaspoons oil in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Cook onion, stirring, for 5 minutes or until softened. Add garlic, cumin, paprika, oregano and chilli flakes. Cook, stirring for 1 minute or until fragrant. Add mince. Cook, breaking up lumps with a wooden spoon, for 5 minutes or until browned all over.
2. Add crushed tomatoes and capsicum. Season with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring, for 2 minutes and add rice. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 10 minutes or until rice is heated through. Stir in chopped coriander.
3. Meanwhile, heat remaining oil in a small frying pan over medium-high heat. Cook haloumi, in 2 batches, for 2 to 3 minutes each side or until golden.
4. Arrange avocado, haloumi, lettuce, halved tomatoes, chilli and lime on mince mixture. Serve sprinkled with extra coriander.

Centenary of Legacy History item #10

Our First History Book

Our Club is in the process of producing a history of our first 100 years for publication in time for our Centenary in 2028. However, it was in the last years of the 1960s when the Club, then the Legacy Club of Adelaide Inc. was just over 40 years old, that the Board decided the good work of Legacy in South Australia, Broken Hill and Northern Territory needed to be recorded.

By this time the veterans of WWII had taken over the Club leadership positions from the WWI men who had established the Club and dependant numbers had increased significantly as a result of WWII.

Thus, '*Fathers Anonymous*' Legacy in South Australia, Broken Hill and Northern Territory, was published in 1970.

Ill health forced Mr Frank Silwood¹ to resign from the Club's General Secretary role in 1967. With the background of 10 years as General Secretary, in retirement he spent the next two years compiling material for a Club history. Thus, the inspiration for the book came from Silwood.

A committee of Legatees – Charles Thomas (Chairman), Charles Wright, William Veale, Jack Riseley, Ken Price and Dudley Coleman² with Bob Stewart the Administrative Officer, was given the task of expanding Silwood's important work which formed eventually formed nine of the book's chapters, into a detailed and informative history of the activities of Legacy in South Australia, Broken Hill and Northern Territory. The then Governor and Patron of the Club, H.E. Major General Sir James Harrison KCMG, CB, CBE (a retired Australian Army officer) provided the Forward.

¹ Frank Silwood was Adelaide Legacy's third General Secretary from 1956 until resigning due to ill health in 1967. During WWII he served in the AIF as a chaplain, and he had resigned from the Methodist Ministry also due to ill health some months before joining Legacy's staff. In retirement he spent the next two years compiling material for a Club history.

² Legatee Dudley Coleman, the Editor of *Father's Anonymous*, was a journalist, editor and author of long standing. In 1969 he was Night Editor of the *Adelaide Advertiser*. In WWII he served overseas with the 2/3 Australian Field Regiment, AIF. For the last nine months of the War, he was Editor of *Army News* in Darwin.

Centenary of Legacy History item #10

Our First History Book

One of the Committee, Legatee Charles Wright was a friend of the South Australian artist, Ivor Hele who during WWII had been an official war artist. When approached by Wright, he readily agreed to produce a painting for use with the book. The resulting evocative painting was used as the book's dust jacket and 'set a tone for the book in a way that words often cannot'. (The story of this painting will be the subject of a later History item).

Interestingly, the 1969 Annual Report advised that the Club had a total of 11,011 widows and children throughout SA, Broken Hill and the Northern Territory enrolled, and it was noted that the peak of Legacy work had not yet been reached. During the year 155 widows with children (312 children) had been registered plus a further 509 widows without children. There were 630 Legatees all men who had served overseas.

Nationally there were some 68,000 widows and 36,000 children, up from 34,000 widows and 27,000 children in 1960³.

In presenting the 42nd Annual Report covering the activities of the Legacy Club of Adelaide for the year ended 31st December 1969, Legatee President J Owen Geddes⁴ when reporting under the topic of History, wrote:

'When he Retired from the position of General Secretary, Frank Silwood took it upon himself to write a history of Adelaide Legacy, and when he submitted his work to us, we realised it needed enlarging to become a true record of the Club.

Accordingly, the Chairmen of the various Groups and Committees were invited to subscribe information relating to their particular activities, and these have all been moulded together by Legatee Dudley Coleman acting as Editor in conjunction with the history Sub-Committee. It is hoped that "Fathers Anonymous" will be available at about the same time as this report. I am sure you will agree with me when you read this book, that the Club owes a debt of gratitude to all those who have helped compile it.

Other Capital City Clubs have already published their histories but now after 42 years thanks to the initiative of Frank Silwood, our history is in Print.'

⁴Legatee Geddes served in the AIF in WWII and as a Captain was on the headquarters of 26th Infantry Brigade during the Tarakan Campaign in Borneo for which service he was appointed a MBE (Member of the Order of the British Empire). It appears he may have also been previously Mentioned in Despatches (MID). Three of his four brothers also served in WWII with one KIA in Syria with the South Australian 2/27 Infantry Battalion. Legatee Geddes died in 1996.
